

- · Create an elevator pitch
 - An elevator pitch is a first impression someone has of you and your brand.
 It sums up unique aspects of your business or personal brand and gets a conversation started.



Career Vision Examples:


Your statement is meant to express who you are as an individual and what your career goal is.
